CTE Dual Credit

AHS has a partnership with Everett Community College to award both high school and college credit for specific vocational courses. There are no tuition or class fees associated with earning college credit in these courses. Students must earn a C or higher in the class to be eligible for college credit. Students work with their teachers to get enrolled in the college credit through EvCC.

Current approved CTE dual credit courses for 2020-2021 include:

Accounting 1 (ACCT 110, 5 college credits)

Business Math (BUS 130, 5 college credits)

MS Office (CL 103, 2 college credits)

Sports Medicine 1 (HLTH 100, 5 college credits)

Human Body Systems (HLTH 100, 5 college credits, HLTH 102, 5 college credits)

Metal Manufacturing 1 (WELD 154, 2 college credits)

Regional Apprenticeship Pathway (RAP)

Periods 1-3 at MPHS + Periods 4-6 at AHS

Open to 11th and 12th graders who want to learn electrical, labor, architecture, and construction trades skills. RAP is a state-recognized trades pre-apprenticeship program offered to high school juniors, seniors (+5 year seniors), and currently enrolled EvCC students. Students gain trade skill experience in carpentry, electrical, concrete, welding, site layout, rigging, and print reading. Skills mastered lead to industry certification, college credit, and preferred entry into a professional apprenticeship. Students from across Snohomish County participate in R.A.P., engaging in real-world career-focused instruction. Students will spend an extended period participating in either a morning or afternoon session (3 periods per day) on projects allowing for more profound levels of understanding and experiential learning. Previous construction coursework or experience is advantageous but not required.

- **Architecture & Construction:** 1.0 CTE, 1.0 3rd Year Mathematics, 1.0 Lab Science or Elective Credit(s), 12 EVCC Manufacturing Employment Readiness MFG T 102 credits.
- **Skilled Trades:** 1.0 CTE, 1.0 ELA, 1.0 P.E. or Elective Credit(s), 5 EVCC Manufacturing Employment Readiness MFG T 101 credits.
- **CERTIFICATIONS:** Upon completing the RAP program and required testing, students earn certifications in OSHA, Core Plus, and Manufacturing Employment Readiness MFG T 102.

College in the High School

Courses are taken at AHS for high school and college credit

Earn high school AND college credit for the following courses taught at AHS by AHS teachers --these courses are articulated through Everett Community College for the college credit. Cost is \$220 per 5 credit course --less than half the price of regular college tuition. Fee waivers are available for students eligible for free/reduced lunch. See your counselor or teacher for details. The grade earned in class is the grade that will appear on both the high school and EvCC transcript.

Running Start

Courses are taken at a local community college for both high school and college credit

Running Start is a tuition-free program open to all Junior and Senior high school students ready for college-level academic or technical training courses. Running Start students typically attend classes at a local community college and do not pay tuition, but must pay for textbooks, class fees, parking fees, and have their own transportation.
